
Stephen Ministers are *compassionate* caregivers; they share their care receivers' pain and help them bear it. They embody Jesus' promise to never let us suffer alone.

Stephen Ministry is...

a ministry in which one caring person reaches out to another.

We all experience challenges in life-times when we could benefit from the support of a caring Christian friend. Stephen Ministers are ready to provide the emotional and spiritual care we need when faced with a crisis or difficulty, such as...

- · Ioneliness and fear
- depression
- terminal illness or hospitalization—your own, a family member, or friend
- grief from the death of a loved one
- unemployment or job loss
- spiritual crisis
- a new baby or blended family
- dealing with disabilities/chronic disease
- · separation or divorce
- worry about aging and its effect on lifestyle
- · changing jobs or location
- coping with empty nest syndrome
- recovery after an accident or disaster

Stephen Ministers Are...

caring, supportive Christians who want to bring Christ's love to those who are in times of crisis, grief or other need. They are...

- A child of God who walks beside a person who is hurting
- A congregation member with gifts for care giving, who was carefully selected to serve in this role
- A lay person who has received extensive training in providing emotional and spiritual care
- A caring, Christian friend who listens, cares, prays, supports, and encourages
- Someone who will "be there" for his or her care receiver, meeting faithfully for about an hour each week, for as long as there's a need

- · Professional Counselors
- Ordained Pastors
- Providers of domestic services such as babysitting, preparing meals or transportation
- Experts in law, finance or church doctrine

by prayerfully dedicating themselves to expressing Christ's love to others in a caring relationship.

Stephen Ministers Are Committed Christian People Who...

- complete 50 hours of initial training in vital caring skills, meeting once a week for approximately five months
- pledge 18 months of service, participating in regular support and supervision twice a month under the guidance of trained Stephen Leaders
- visit a care receiver regularly and dependably, offering Christian care and support
- preserve the confidential nature of the caring relationship
- listen and care with unbiased love
